#### FROM THE EDITOR

Here we go again! Recently we reported that the CFDS Quarterly was right smack on schedule and that from now on it would all be smooth sailing. Well, you have also heard of the recent government financial restraints imposed on the Dept. of National Defence, so it should come as no surprise that in addition to some cuts in our various budgets the Quarterly has also felt the pinch. The publication of this Newsletter instead of the regular issue of the Quarterly is a direct result of these current hard times.

Back in November we were "asked" (directed in a polite manner) to cancel the final issue of the Quarterly for this fiscal year and the first issue for next year to reduce costs. More recently we have been informed that all funds relating to publications have been frozen pending a decision by a special committee, chaired by the Vice Chief of the Defence Staff, on the future of all Service periodicals. Unfortunately, this could at best delay and may even mean cancellation of Vol 19 No 3 of the Quarterly which was ready to go to press in late November.

In the interim, it is DGDS's decision that this and at least one future Newsletter will be produced "in house" to provide some continuity of CFDS news for our readers.

Hopefully, a decision on the future of the Quarterly will be available in time for the next issue of the Newsletter.

#### DIVISION NEWS

#### Postings

The promotion of Col Taylor, 28 Jul 78, initiated a cycle of postings which saw LCol Deyette move to Esquimalt as replacement CO of No 11 Dental Unit and LCol Lanctis become CO of No 1 Dental Unit. Col Taylor assumed his new duties as Director of Dental Plans ans Requirements at NDHQ/DGDS 21 Aug 78.

#### DGDS Activities

In mid-July BGen Thompson, accompanied by LCol Fortier, travelled to Camp Ipperwash, southwest of London, on Lake Huron, to observe the Phase II and III DOTP candidates in action during a field exercise which is part of their summer training. Most of the afternoon was spent in discussions with the candidates and an informal visit of the field set-up. The next week BGen Thompson acted as reviewing officer at the DOTP Graduation Parade in CFB Borden and was the guest of honour at the mess dinner which followed the parade.

BGen Thompson represented the CFDS at the CDA Board of Governors Meeting held in conjunction with the Canadian Dental Association Convention in Winnipeg, Manitoba, from 9 to 13 September 1978.

The Fédération Dentaire Internationale Congress was held in Madrid, Spain, from 19 to 30 September 1978. BGen Thompson, in his role as Chairman of the Commission on Armed Forces Dental Services of the FDI, attended the Congress.

#### Staff Activities

LCo1 J.F. Begin attended the 15 Dental Unit Conference held at CFB Valcartier 28-29 Sep 78. LCo1 Begin presented a paper explaining the functioning of the Division and the responsibilities of each staff officer. Included in the presentation was a brief update on the Preventive Dentistry Program and an analysis of Performance Measurement.

Every year, the fall of the first leaves signal the start of the DOTP recruiting drive and this year was no exception. From early September to mid-December, LCol Fortiet travelled the country from sea to sea to visit the ten Canadian faculties of dentistry. Last year's objective of recruiting 25 students was attained and 18 students have enrolled so far this year.

LCol Hank Griesbach travelled to Nova Scotia to put a stamp of reality on his Philosophy of Design for a new dental clinic in Halifax. He inspected the clinics, old and new, in Halifax, Shearwater, Greenwood and Cornwallis, and after working hours had a taste of the Bluenosers' legendary hospitality. The Halifax project calls for a 100-bed hospital and 26-chair dental clinic, to be built in Stadacona and completed in 1982.

The design of a new mobile dental clinic to replace the old "Van" is going ahead as scheduled. The Statement of Requirement for this project is the basis of continuing work involving several directorates of NDHQ. But alas, here as in the case of the Halifax project, being the old man that he is, LCol Griesbach won't be around to see the fruit of his labour. Sic transit gloria mundi.

A "Special Personnel Qualification Requirement" which forms the basis for our future Base Dental Officer Course, has been approved by Director Military Occupational Structures, designated Classification Specialty Qualification Code 51.A2, and passed to Director Individual Training for action regarding the course and training schedule. This course will take the guesswork out of being a Base Dental Officer.

A new CFDS publication "Dental Directives" recently authorized by DGDS is being processed and will first be issued in the new year. Dental Directives will serve to communicate the details of dental policy and provide dental technical advice to dental units. They will normally be distributed to all full-time detachments through Commanding Officers.

Amendments of 32 Canadian Forces Dental Orders are also in the works. Another 14 were published recently.
