### THE CAP BADGE

"Within a wreath of stylized maple leaves Or, a cartouche vert edged Or, charged with the Rod of Aesculapius and a Crusador sword in saltine argent, in front of which is the Greek symbol Delta argent, the whole ensigned with the Royal Crown Proper".

What is the significance of the badge? The wreath of stylized gold maple leaves indicates that it is Canadian and although it has ten leaves, they do not represent the ten provinces by intention but are stylized because the leaf on the Canadian Flag is stylized. The gold cartouche, which according to the Oxford Dictionary is archaeologically speaking, an "oval ring containing hieroglyphic names and titles of Egyptian Kings etc", has no real significance in the badge other than to contain the "device". To explain the device, it contains three parts. First, the "Rod of Aesculapius" - a rod or staff with a single serpent entwined around, which appears in ancient representations of Aesculapius, the God of Healing. Since it is the only true symbol of the healing arts, it appropriately identifies dentistry as one of the healing sciences. Secondly, the "Crusador sword" depicts the military environment of our dental service. Thirdly, the "Delta" is the fourth letter of the Greek alphabet which in this emblem denotes dentistry. Finally, the "Royal Crown Proper" ensigns the whole and indicates allegiance to the Queen. Inherent also in the significance of the badge design is the fact that it maintains the general outline of the RCDC badge and thereby provides some measure of continuity. Further, the device is an adaptation of the Canadian Dental Association symbol for dentistry and finally, since the dental service for all elements of the Armed Forces is provided from a single dental source, it is truly distinctive.

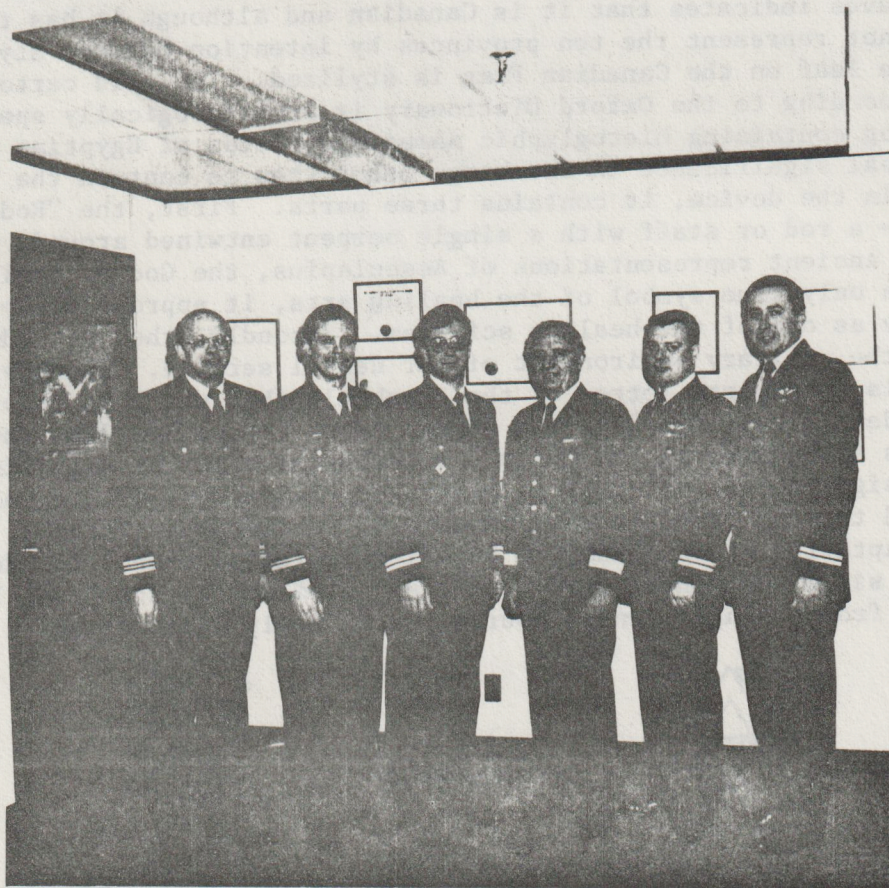
CFAO 32-3, Band Marches and Calls, will be amended in due course. Copies of the music for this march will be distributed by DC to all brass-reed bands of the CF.

## CANADIAN FORCES DENTAL SERVICE SCHOOL

I first met Pte Albert during my arrival tour of CFDSS facilities. Pte Albert was introduced to me as one of my more stalwart staff; one who could be relied upon to complete all tasks as required day or night. His dedication to duty and the high performance of his work were soon apparent.

The Canadian Forces Dental Service School began 1983 with representatives at the annual New Year's Levees in Ottawa as well as at CFB Borden. Capt S.A. Becker attended the Governor General's Levee in Ottawa while other officers attended the New Year's Levee at CFB Borden.

During the first quarter of 1983, officers clinical courses were conducted in general dentistry (12-26 Jan), endodontics (09-23 Feb) and fixed partial prosthodontics (02-16 Mar). #### Field Experience - A Report by Cpl(W) S. Brine, Det North Bay

In Sept 82, duty beckoned Capt Dubickas and myself, Cpl Sue Brine from CFB North Bay to the call of combat. Rendezvous was the Dental Clinic at CFB Petawawa on 20 Sep 82 for our final day instructions before Capt Demers and Pte Weir escorted us out to the field state. The dental van was awaiting us already set-up in a picturesque grove with the door facing towards the lake. Accommodation consisted of a tent approximately 10' by 12', with a floor of pallets covered with cocco matting. The luxuries included were an electric light and two cots. The Herman Nelson never did arrive. A major surprise for me was the realization that I was the only female out there; however, the advantage of this was having been assigned my own outhouse (a threeholer). The dental van became a change, wash and beauty aid room in the morning, a work area during the day, and a warm retreat to relax in during the evening.

Reveille, at 0600 hrs, was carried out by the duty camp crier and followed by the tent shaking, the generators roaring to life, and the lights coming on. Like a true soldier, I crawled out of my warm sleeping bag to face the morning chill and dash over to the dental van to start the heater. Following our morning ablutions, it was over to the mess tent where the food was always hot and plentiful. It also provided us with a place to gather in the evenings to watch a movie, play cards or socialize with other comrades. We would be ready to begin our work day by 0730 - 0800 hrs.

Equipment in the van worked well with the exception of the X-rays we attempted to develop but never mastered. We managed to complete most of the examinations and treatments required. The cooperation of the men in the field, ensuring patients were notified and available for appointments, along with the appreciation expressed for work done, created a very pleasant working environment.

One highlight of the week occurred when a lonely, lost soldier mistakenly drifted into the tent looking for companionship, and Capt Dubickas' instant, instinctive combat training surfaced as he ordered the man out. Another highlight was being able to have exclusive use of the shower on our final day in the field to wash off the week's accumulated grime before our return to civilization.

To sum it all up, the time spent in the field was both informative and enjoyable.

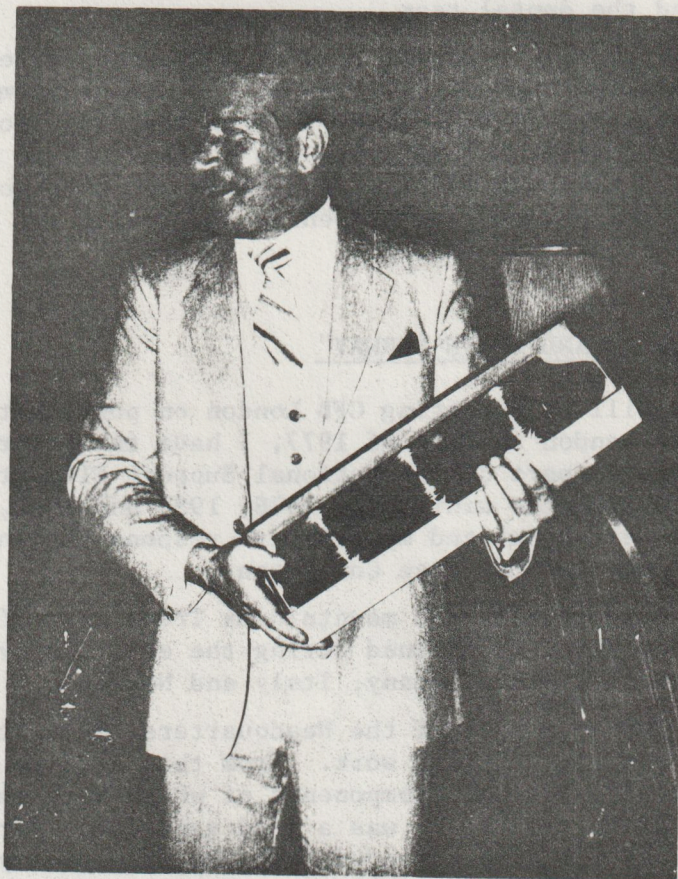


Retirement 431 408 087 WO Kallman, Lyall James MOC 724 DE Tech

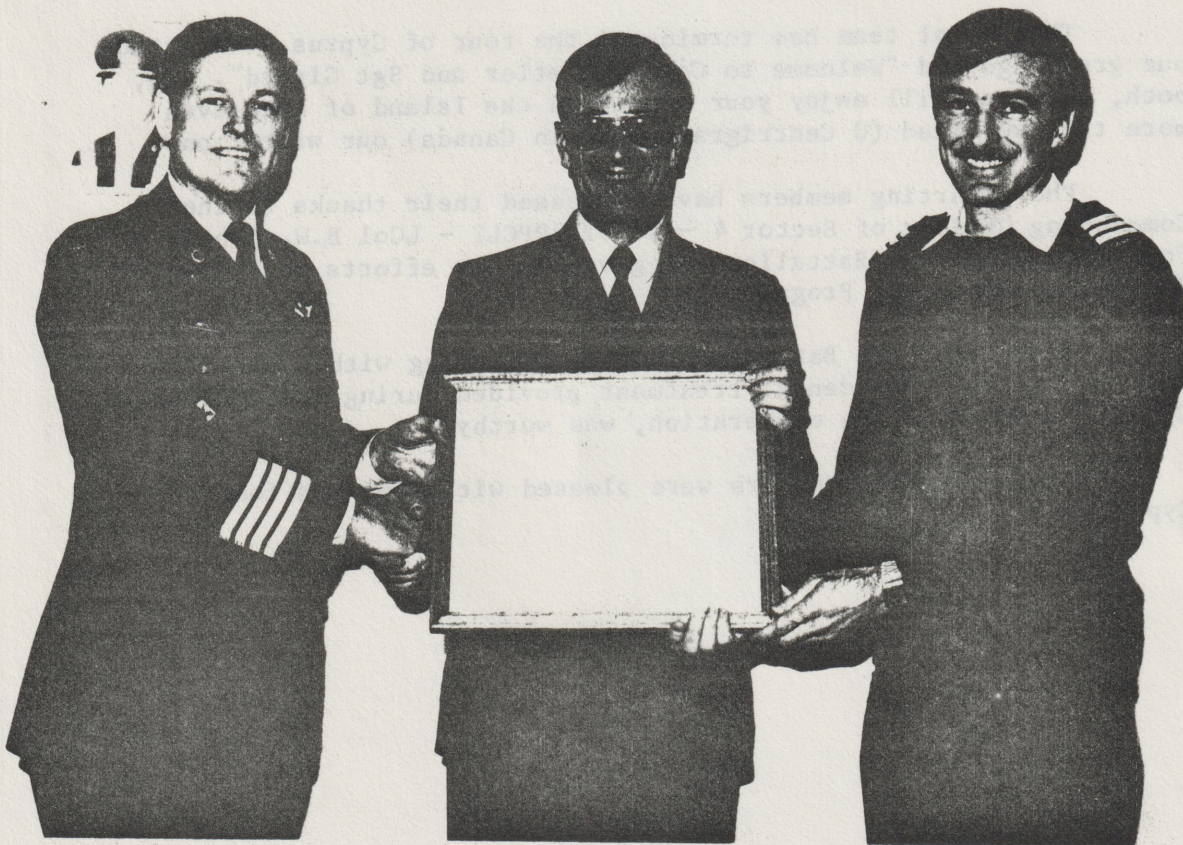
