Honourary Appointment - Colonel Commandant CFDS
Brigadier-General W.R. Thompson (Ret'd) CMM, CD, QHDS, DDS, FRCD(C),
FICD

The position of Colonel Commandant is an honorary appointment which is held in high esteem and is accorded to a retired senior officer of the concerned Branch. As Colonel Commandant, BGen Thompson's duties will include fostering esprit de corps throughout the Dental Branch and advising the Chief of the Defence Staff on matters of significance to the Canadian Forces Dental Services.

BGen Thompson's long and distinguished military career commenced in 1943. During World War II he served with the Canadian Army as a dental assistant and subsequently qualified as a Navigator in the Royal Canadian Air Force. Following World War II he entered the Faculty of Dentistry, University of Toronto, obtaining his Doctor of Dental Surgery in 1949. He re-entered the Canadian Forces during his final year of studies at the University of Toronto and upon graduation came to duty as a Captain in the Royal Canadian Dental Corps.

BGen Thompson is a certified specialist in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, having received his training at Walter Reed Army Medical Centre in Washington, the University of Toronto, and the Toronto General Hospital.

He has served as base dental officer at Petawawa, St. Hubert, and Gagetown; as senior dental officer with 1 Fighter Wing in Marville, France, and as an instructor at the Canadian Forces Dental Service School at CFB Borden. He also served with 25 Canadian Field Dental Unit in Korea.

From 1970-74 he was Commanding Officer of 13 Dental Unit at CFB Trenton. During this period he also served as oral surgeon for Kingston Military Hospital.

General Thompson served on two occasions as a staff officer in the Division of Dental Services at National Defence Headquarters. He was Director of Dental Treatment Services at NDHQ until he became Director General of Dental Services in 1976.

In 1973, General Thompson was appointed an Honorary Dental Surgeon to the Queen and also was inducted as a fellow of the International College of Dentists. In 1979 he was inducted as an Honorary Fellow of the Royal College of Dentists of Canada and also was presented with the Pierre Fouchard Medal by the National Order of Dental Surgeons of France for his contributions to international dentistry.

In June 1981, he was appointed to the Order of Military Merit at the level of Commander. In the same year he was honoured in Rio de Janeiro when he was presented with the Merit Award by the Fédération Dentaire Internationale (FDI) in recognition of his contributions as Chairman of the Commission of Defence Forces Dental Services of the FDI. After release from the Canadian Forces in 1982, General Thompson served as President of the Canadian Dental Association.

Nomination Honorifique - colonel commandant du SDFC
Brigadier-général (retraité) W.R. Thompson, CMM, CD, QHDS, DDS, FRCD(C),

Le poste de colonel commandant est une nomination honorifique de grande valeur qui est accordée à un haut gradé à la retraite dans son domaine de spécialisation. En tant que colonel commandant, le général Thompson sera appelé à renforcer l'esprit de corps du Service dentaire et de conseiller le Chef de l'État-major de la Défense sur les sujets pertinent à cette direction générale.

Le général Thompson a débuté sa carrière militaire en 1943. Au cours de la Deuxième Guerre mondiale, il servit dans l'Armée canadienne en qualité d'aide-dentiste avant de se qualifier en tant que navigateur aérien dans l'Aviation royale du Canada. Après la guerre, il obtint en 1949 son doctorat en chirurgie dentaire de l'Université de Toronto. Il se joignit à nouveau à l'Armée canadienne au cours de sa dernière année d'études et au moment de sa graduation, commença son service comme capitaine du Corps dentaire royal canadien.

Le général Thompson s'est spécialisé dans les domaines de la chirurgie bucco-dentaire et maxillo-faciale après avoir reçu sa formation au Walter Reed Army Medical Centre (Washington), à l'Université de Toronto et au Toronto General Hospital.

Le général Thompson a été affecté successivement comme dentiste militaire à Petawawa, St-Hubert et Gagetown, comme dentiste militaire en chef auprès de la l^{ere} Escadre d'avions de chasse à Marville (France) et en tant qu'instructeur de l'École du Service dentaire des Forces canadiennes à la BFC Borden.

De 1970 à 1974, il a été commandant de la 13^e Unité dentaire à la BFC Trenton. À la même époque, il a aussi agi à titre de chirurgien-buccal à l'hôpital militaire de Kingston.

Le général Thompson servit à deux reprises au sein de la Division du Service dentaire au Quartier général de la Défense nationale où il occupa le poste de directeur du Service dentaire (soins) avant de devenir, en 1976, directeur général du Service dentaire.

En 1973, le général Thompson a été nommé chirurgien dentiste honoraire de la reine et membre du Collège international des dentistes. En 1979, il a été nommé membre honoraire du Collège royal des dentistes du Canada et s'est vu décerner la médaille Pierre Fouchard par l'Ordre national des chirurgiens dentistes de France pour sa contribution à la dentisterie internationale.

En juin 1981, il reçut le grade de commandeur de l'Ordre du Mérite militaire. Au cours de la même année, la Fédération dentaire internationale (FDI) lui attribua son prix du mérite à Rio de Janeiro, en reconnaissance de sa contribution à titre de Président de la commission du service dentaire des Forces de défense. Après avoir quitté les Forces canadiennes en 1982, le général Thompson devint le président de l'Association dentaire canadienne.

NEWS FROM DDTS/DDPR DIRECTORATES

DDTS, Col Begin chaired the CFDS Stores Committee Meeting on 27 & 28 November with LCol Lemieux acting as recording secretary. Since this meeting LCol Lemieux, Maj Shore and CWO Beauchamp have been kept busy finalizing the staff work eminating from this meeting.

On 4 Dec, Col Begin chaired the second annual DOTP Selection Board and then proceeded to Toronto to attend the annual Provincial Secretaries and Registrars Conference. In the interim period, Col Begin has been in the throes of planning for the joint meeting of the Canadian and Ontario Societies of Public Health Dentists, to be held in conjunction with the Canadian Dental Association meeting in Ottawa in Sep 85.

DDTS-3, LCol Lemieux and DDTS 4-2, CWO Beauchamp were off to Chicago on 20-24 Feb 85 to attend the Chicago Mid-Winter Dental Convention. LCol Lemieux liked travelling so much he followed this trip with a visit to Winnipeg or is that "Winterpeg" on 1 & 2 March for demonstrations by the Caulk Company on tooth artistry and on the new generation of restorative materials for both anterior andd posterior teeth. LCol Lemieux during late January and early February has been active consolidating material for the CFDS Annual Report.

DDTS-3, Maj Bob Cooper, our numbers cruncher at the Dental Services Division, has been compiling statistics for the CFDS Annual Report; and in addition to this has been busy initiating studies required to determine a requirement for ADP equipment within the Dental Services Division/CFDS.

DDTS 4-2, CWO Cliff Beauchamp and WO Bruce Hannay proceeded to 1 CFSD Dental Equipment Workshop in Toronto on 20-25 January to resolve a series of problems relating to quality control, packaging and the distribution of dental material. WO Hannay has been busy this past quarter reviewing the specifications of items in CFP 203 our Dental Stores Catalogue. This is a long term project which hopefully will be completed in the not to distant future.

DDPR, LCol McQueen visited 15 Dental Unit HQ in December 84 to review proposed plans for a new dental clinic at CFB Valcartier. A decision on funding and final approval is expected by mid 1985.

On 10-12 January 85 BGen Wright and LCol McQueen attended the Conference of Defence Associations Annual Meeting in Ottawa.

LCol McQueen and Maj Cooper attended the National Conference on the decline of Dental Caries in Montreal on 1 & 2 February 85. This conference was jointly sponsored by the Canadian Dental Association and the Dental Faculty of McGill University.

On the social side LCol McQueen generously hosted the Dental Services Division staff officers to a Grey Cup Party on 18 Nov 84. While DDTS, with assistance from DDPR and the DG, sponsored a gourmet Christmas luncheon for DGDS staff members prior to the Christmas break. Several members from the Dental Services Division attended the Governor General's New Year's Levy at Rideau Hall on 20 Jan 85 and the CFDS Bonspiel in Borden on the 7-8 Feb 85.

Nouvelles du DSD Soins et du DSDPB

Les 27 et 28 novembre 1984, le colonel Begin (DSD Soins) a présidé la réunion du Comité d'évaluation de l'approvisionnement du SDFC à laquelle le lieutenant-colonel Lemieux faisait fonction de secrétaire. Depuis, ce dernier ainsi que le major Shore et l'adjudant-chef Beauchamp consacrent beaucoup d'efforts à la finalisation de tout le travail connexe.

Le colonel Begin a également présidé le deuxième comité de sélection des candidats au PFDM, tenu le 4 décembre. Il s'est ensuite rendu à Toronto où il a assisté à la Conférence des secrétaires des associations dentaires provinciales. Il a aussi commencé à planifier la réunion des sociétés canadienne et ontarienne des dentistes en hygiène publique, laquelle sera tenue conjointement avec la réunion de l'Association dentaire canadienne, à Ottawa, en septembre 1985.

Le lieutenant-colonel Lemieux, DSD Soins 2, et l'adjudant-chef Beauchamp, DSD Soins 4-2, ont participé, à Chicago, au colloque dentaire organisé du 20 au 24 février dernier. Puisque le lieutenant-colonel Lemieux rafolle des voyages, il s'est ensuite envolé vers Winnipeg où il a assisté, les ler et 2 mars, à des démonstrations données par la compagnie Caulk sur l'art dentaire et sur la nouvelle génération de matériaux de restauration des dents antérieures et postérieures. Durant la fin de janvier et le début de février, le lieutenant-colonel Lemieux s'est surtout attardé à préparer le terrain en vue de la publication du rapport annuel du SDFC.

Notre gobe-chiffres à la Division, le major Bob Cooper (DSD Soins 3), s'est occupé de compiler les statistiques utiles aux fins du rapport annuel. En outre, il a préparé une série d'études qui permettront de déterminer les besoins de la Division du Service dentaire et du SDFC en matériel informatisé.

L'adjudant-chef Cliff Beauchamp (DSD Soins 4-2) et l'adjudant Bruce Hannay se sont rendus, du 20 au 25 janvier dernier, au 1^{er} atelier de matériel dentaire du SDFC afin d'y régler certains problèmes liés au contrôle de la qualité, à l'emballage et à la distribution du matériel dentaire. Ce dernier trimestre, l'adjudant Hannay a consacré une bonne partie de ses efforts à la révision des spécifications des articles répertoriés dans la PFC 203, le Catalogue du matériel dentaire. Il s'agit là d'un projet à long terme dont on espère voir la fin dans un avenir plutôt rapproché.

En décembre 1984, le lieutenant-colonel McQueen (DSDPB) a pris connaissance, dans les locaux du Quartier général de la 15^e Unité dentaire, des plans d'aménagement d'une nouvelle clinique dentaire à la BFC Valcartier. On prévoit recevoir, d'ici au milieu de 1985, la décision quant au financement et l'approbation finale du projet.

Le brigadier-général Wright et le lieutenant-colonel McQueen ont assisté à la réunion annuelle de l'Association dentaire canadienne organisée, du 10 au 12 janvier dernier, à Ottawa.

Le lieutenant-colonel McQueen et le major Cooper se sont rendus à Montréal, les ler et 2 février, dans le cadre de la Conférence nationale de l'ADC sur la baisse de la carie dentaire. La Conférence était parrainée par l'Association dentaire canadienne et la Faculté de médecine dentaire de l'Université McGill.

Parmi les activités sociales organisées, mentionnons que le 18 novembre 1984, le lieutenant-colonel McQueen a convié les officiers d'état-major de la Division du Service dentaire à un "party" de la coupe Grey. Aussi, le DSD Soins appuyé du DSDPB et du DG ont préparé, avant les vacances, un déjeuner de Noël tout à fait exquis auquel était invité le personnel de la Direction générale. 23rd ANNUAL CFDS BONSPIEL

The Canadian Forces Dental Service School hosted the 23rd Annual Canadian Forces Dental Services Bonspiel from 7-9 Feb 85. (Unofficially it did not end until the wee hours of 10 Feb).

The success of this year's Bonspiel was guaranteed by the large turnout of active and retired members of the CFDS and RCDC, plus civilian friends. In the last few years, participation in this event has exploded and this year's gathering of the clan was no exception. One hundred and eighty four curlers (46 teams the largest ever) competed with 205 attending the presentation dinner on the Saturday night.

The curling began early Thursday evening in order to accommodate the large number of rinks. Later that evening, curlers and spectators enjoyed an informal "Meet & Greet" in the Buell Bldg during which many old acquaintances were renewed, many new ones made, and many posting plots discussed. The Bonspiel continued throughout Friday and concluded late Saturday afternoon at the Circle Pine Rink with finals in the four events.

The festivities concluded with an awards banquet catered in exceptional style by the Homestead Restaurant. Head table guests included BGen J.N. Wright, DGDS; BGen K.M. Baird (ret'd); BGen W.R. Thompson (ret'd); Col J.F. Begin, DDTS; Col J.M. Donely, Comdt CFDSS; Col H.W. Brogan, CO 12 DU; Col M.N. Deyette, CO 13 DU; Col H.S. Wood, CO 14 DU; Col L.A. Richardson (ret'd); Cols P. Cook and W. Brokaw, U.S.A.D.C. of Fort Knox, Kentucky; and Maj C. Hunt (ret'd), President, Royal Canadian Dental Corps Association.

BGen Wright addressed the gathering on a variety of topics including the "State of the CFDS". During the banquet BGen Wright announced the CDS's appointment of BGen W.R. Thompson (ret'd) as the new Colonel Commandant of the CFDS and presented BGen Thompson with his appointment script duly signed by MND and Governor General. BGen Wright concluded by expressing his appreciation to Capt W.B. Fleming and the CFDSS Bonspiel Committee on the outstanding success of the 23rd Spiel.

23e TOURNOI ANNUEL DE CURLING DU SDFC

L'École du Service dentaire des Forces canadiennes a organisé le 23^e tournoi annuel de curling du SDFC, qui s'est déroulé du 7 au 9 février dernier (le tournoi s'est officieusement clôturé aux petites heures du matin le 10).

Cette année, le tournoi a connu un succès monstre grâce, en grande partie, à la participation d'un nombre considérable de membres actifs et à la retraite du SDFC et du CDRC, sans compter nos ami(e)s civil(e)s. Depuis les dernières années, le tournoi suscite de plus en plus d'intérêt, et la 23º rencontre n'a pas fait exception à la règle. Quelque 184 joueurs réunis en 46 équipes (nombre record) se sont affrontés et 205 personnes prenaient place au dîner et à la présentation des trophés, le samedi soir.

La première manche a débuté en soirée le jeudi, suivie d'une rencontre à l'Édifice Buell, où retrouvailles et amitiés nouvelles ont marqué le clou de la journée. Certains joueurs en ont d'ailleurs profité pour dresser des plans de bataille. Le tournoi s'est poursuivi pendant la journée du vendredi et les finales, dans les quatre disciplines, ont été disputées en fin d'après-midi samedi, sur les glaces du Circle Pine.

Le tournoi s'est clôturé de façon extraordinaire par la remise des trophés et un banquet servi par le restaurant Homestead. Figurent parmi les invités de marque les brigadiers-généraux J.N. Wright (DGSD), K.M. Baird (retraité) et W.R. Thompson (retraité), les colonels J.F. Begin (DSD Soins), J.M. Donely (cmdt ÉSDFC), H.W. Brogan (cmdt 12 U dent), M.N. Deyette (cmdt 13 U dent), H.S. 


Field Dental Company Cadre

The first allocated three FMC FY 85/86 DSR II credits to the CFDS to establish one field dental company cadre and promised an additional two positions from FY 86/87 credits to augment the cadre. Although insufficient positions were given to allow for the birth of an independent field dental company, the allocation of the positions allows the CFDS to create the cadre as part of Headquarters 15 Dental Unit until sufficient manpower is available to justify the creation of an independent unit. 
REGULAR FORCE FIELD DENTAL COMPANY

General

A busy September has come and gone and opened the door to an equally busy October and November.

It all started with the Staff Assistance Visit 1-5 Oct 84, which was conducted by Maj Shore, DDTS-4, and Major Sutherland, DDPR-3 from the Dental Services Division. Unfortunately, the weather was not too cooperative during this time; however, the AO of 35 Dent Unit was able to show the team some of the Black Forest area. The weather was much more favourable when the AO accompanied Maj Sutherland on a bus trip to South Tirol, Northern Italy. December was relatively quiet and the only duty travel was done by MWO Rector, Clinic Coordinator Lahr, and Sgt Girard, Hygienist Baden. They were part of a German/Canadian WO's and Sgt's Seminar in Lahnstein, FRG, 10-14 Dec 84. MWO Rector's article of this seminar is outlined on page 41.

The annual 35 Dental Unit Christmas Party was held 7 Dec 84 at the restaurant in the Stadthalle in Lahr. Dr. Kelly and his staff, from the Lahr Dependent's Dental Clinic, organized the affair, which was well attended with representatives from all detachments.

The New Year started out cold and snowy; as a matter of fact, it was the coldest it has been in more than 40 years. It almost felt like Canada.

CO travelled to Ottawa 12 to 18 January 1985 to attend the DGDS/Unit COs Workshop and found it almost Spring-like after the Siberian winter that we were experiencing.

GERMAN/CANADIAN WO'S & SGT'S SEMINAR INNERE FUHRUNG - BY MWO B.C. RECTOR

The Zentrum Innere Führung is the leadership and civic educational training centre for officers and NCOs of the Bundeswehr. Like our own CF leadership academies, the Zentrum Innere Führung conducts courses and provides training aides in regard to leadership, political and historical education, training methods and military discipline.

It also conducts partnership seminars between the warrant officers and sergeants of the Bundeswehr and those of allied armed forces to promote human relations and exchange information so that the alliance may be further strengthened.

Twelve warrant officers and sergeants of CFE and an equivalent number of their German counterparts were selected to participate in one such seminar held from 10 to 14 December in the centre of Lahnstein which is situated south of Koblenz at the junction of the Rhein and Lahn rivers.

Throughout that week, group participants discussed such topics as principles and aims of leadership, security politics in the alliance, the forces in today's society and women in the services. These agenda items generated lengthy and interesting discussions and enabled participants to gain an appreciation of the thoughts of their counterparts.

Rest assured, the group did not spend all of its time in the classroom. A three-hour wine tasting session was enjoyed and sightseeing trips were made to a local castle, "Festung Ehrenbreitstein".

This seminar permitted soldiers of two nations to meet and freely exchange ideas and socialize with each other thereby establishing closer contacts and further strengthen the NATO alliance.

THE DEW

Although in existance since the 29th of February 1981, the Dental Equipment Workshop (DEW) located at 1 Canadian Forces Supply Depot (1 CFSD), CFB Toronto is virtually an unknown entity in the CFDS.

"Don't you handle our supplies?", "You sent us the wrong stuff!", and "Just what do you people do there anyway?" are the most common telephone and chit chat themes whenever we talk to anyone from the "outside". No one quite seems to know what we do or how we do it. So, it was decided that a brief resume of what we do and how we do it was in order.

1 Dental Equipment Depot (1 DED) located in Petawawa was disbanded in Feb 84 and all dental supplies and equipment moved to 1 CFSD Toronto to become part of the CFSS. At this time Sgt Jim Cornett and Cpl Sandy Muir designed and created a workshop in the middle of bldg. 151 - an 18 acre building. This required extensive electrical, plumbing and structural renovations over a period of 6 months (Sep 80 -Feb 81). Finally in March 1981, the DEW began functioning as a 3rd line dental repair facility. To anyone who may be unfamiliar with the term, a 3rd line repair facility is a workshop where the items of dental equipment are completely rebuilt and refinished, or if rebuilding proves too costly, stripped of usable parts which are stored for future use to fill the requiremens of unit Dental Equipment Technicians. Obsolete items and those deemed "beyond economical repair" are scrapped. The DE has the facilities, manpower, proximity to supplies and manufacturers and most vital, the time and financial means to completely refurbish equipment that would prove too costly in time and money terms for unit repair shops.

The DEW is not part of any dental unit. We belong to 1 CFSD and are a branch of Technical Services for the Depot. We also are responsible to DGDS for technical and professional tasking and direction. Lastly, we are responsible to 13 Dental Unit HQ for 2nd line repair commitments to CFBs Toronto and London.

Our tasking is the same from everyone: "Repair Equipment - Fast!" We're not doing too bad. The statistics say the guys in the shop have been working. From 9 Jan 81 until 7 Feb 85 - 1182 work orders were opened and 1108 were completed, leaving 74 outstanding to date. We have a \$50,000 (flexible) budget and can often pick up parts the same day so our backlog dwindles rapidly which keeps one and all happy.

The DEW's staff has grown in the last four years from the original two techs to 3 plus 1 Supply Tech as of July 1984. At present our staff consists of WO Bill Quine, Cpl Gil Weiers, Cpl Bill Bodfield and Cpl Keith Cummings (Sup Tech).

These people have contributed to the task of making the DEW an efficient and productive shop and an integral part of the CFDS.

In closing I would like to dispel the popular myth that whenever a dental supply problem arises the DEW is involved either as the perpetrator or as the problem solving agency. We become involved only when requested by sections such as Technical Services or Quality Control when they have received a message from NDHQ outlining a problem. The workshop is completely divorced from supply and their procedures at all other times.

The DEW provides a valuable service for every dental unit in Canada and as time progresses our services will expand to include more spare parts variety for unit Dental Equipment Technicians, loaner items, training seminars and comprehensive test facilities for new and rebuilt equipment. The possibilities seem endless.

DGDS VISITS - 1 CFSD/DEW

BGen J.N. Wright visited 1 CFSD on 30 Nov 84, to view the warehouse, see first hand the area where dental materiels are located and inspect the DEW. After a tour of the 18 acre depot BGen Wright visited the DEW to spend some time talking with the staff and inspect the shop. The DG's only comment was the shop was awfully clean - did any work ever get done?

After the tour, an informal luncheon was held for BGen Wright, DEW staff members, personnel of 1 CFSD, including 1 CFSD's Commanding Officer Col W.A. Freeman, the MCO, LCol S.G. Richardson, the MPO, Maj Tessier, the TSO, Mr. D. Cossaboom, the Base Dental Officer, Maj Fallon, and Capt Ferguson a Dental Officer at CFB Toronto.
